Captain's report

The First XI's season began in fine style as we recorded a five wicket win over Burt Shield premiers (2017-2018) Burwood Uniting Canterbury. Being set a total of 222 for victory the chase was controlled by Nick Sparks who recorded his maiden century for the club and finished unbeaten with 106*. It was a sublime innings, finished powerfully with 3 consecutive sixes to record the victory and notch up his ton – well batted mate! It was also great to welcome Darcy Clarke into the team for his first game in MacGibbon Shield. Since returning to the club Darcy has trained hard and performed well in the twos, certainly deserving his First XI cap.

Our opening one-day game came up against Toorak Prahran in wet conditions at Frog Hollow. Bowling first again, we were up against it with Toorak's notoriously strong batting line-up. Tommy Clarke was the pick of our bowlers taking 3/30 as Toorak amassed 192. Our chase began quickly as Jason Pho clipped the first two balls of the innings over square leg for maximums, sending a very ominous message to Toorak that we were up for it. Phoey led the way with 44, supported well by Matt Veitch (40) and Dave McKenna (40*) we reached their total in the final over with a few wickets in hand. Another quality run chase and team performance.

We were fortunate enough to be given the honour of hosting the main game of Keith Carr memorial round. Sadly, Keith passed in the off-season and the ECA ensured his memory was celebrated by dedicating a round to him. As many of our current and past players will know, Keith was a terrific bloke and a true friend of TWCC. He committed much of his life to the ECA as a player and umpire, also serving on the ECA executive for many years. For TWCC to be chosen to host this game shows the regard in which Keith held our club and the continued support from the ECA for our attitude and spirit. Unfortunately, we were beaten by Burwood Uniting, falling 30 runs short of their 205. Nevertheless, this was a memorable game and a special occasion as we celebrated Keith's memory.

A tough away loss followed against Clifton Hill, but we bounced back in big fashion against Glen Waverley and STC in the double header round of the season. In both games we dominated with the ball, dismissing both teams for roughly 100 runs. We chased the runs comfortably to take 12 points from the weekend and enjoy some quality celebrations. Marcus Cawthorne starred with the ball, taking 3/20 and 2/16 across the weekend in his first two games at MacGibbon level. Notable mentions also to Tom Clarke, Nick Sparks and Jake Barker who contributed greatly with the ball.

Our season took a rough turn following disappointing losses to Clifton Hill and Boroondara at home in a return to two-day cricket. The weather went against us, as did some injuries and availabilities which all contributed to below-par performances. On individual levels we saw excellent efforts with the ball from Jake Barker who took 4/74 against Clifton Hill, and Marcus Cawthorne who took 6/42 against the Cobras. Both lads stood tall in tough games and showed great TWCC grit and determination.

A resounding victory against Deepdene finished the calendar year on a winning note and sent us to the break in the four. Sam Jordan led the way with the bat making 44 and batting through some very difficult conditions. Our total of 215 proving far too many for the Deeners who were bowled out for 123, Tommy Clarke doing the damage with 4/49. After the break we got some revenge against Boroondara, skittling them for 114. Tommy and Marcus took 3 each in a dominant display. Our chase was clinical as we passed their score with the loss of only two wickets. A welcome return from Mike Sparks finishing with an unbeaten 72.

We were unable to back up the following week and dropped what would be a pivotal game against Deepdene. Chasing 203 we were in complete control until a middle order collapse saw us fall five runs short. Jake Barker played a gem with 3/33 and 28*.

With our season somewhat on the line we travelled to Hartwell to play STC. In one of the more bizarre games (for many reasons) we were tied on first innings at 65 apiece. STC after batting first did not chase a victory and attempt to set quick runs and unfortunately the game ended in a draw. Our bowling display on day one was exceptional with Nick Sparks taking 8/15. I suggest you speak to a member of the playing XI for the full story on this game... I could go on about it for hours!

We were outplayed by Toorak in the following fixture clearly showing us areas of needed improvement. Gallant efforts from Jake Barker (4/41) and Nick Sparks (3/43) with the ball.

Our final game of the season was a famous victory against Glen Waverley at Frog Hollow. Knowing we needed to win to keep our dreams of playing a final alive we bowled first and in hot and dry conditions Glen Waverley were able to make 240. We chased with great intensity and patience, making the runs in the penultimate over. It was a brilliant team display with even performances across our batsmen and bowlers. It was a victory made sweeter due to the fact all other games had been heated out and we were able to draw on the support of all other TWCC players and supporters!

Unfortunately, results didn't go our way in the final round, and we were left ruing some close losses earlier in the season, eventually missing the finals by one game. It was somewhat fitting that Toorak went on to win the premiership this season, after only losing one game and it's worth noting that we were the only team able to knock them off.

Thank you to the executive, other team captains and the TWCC family for their support this season – we could not have come so close without you all!

Finally, from a captain's perspective I'm disappointed we didn't make finals although I'm extremely proud of the effort shown all year by every player to represent the First XI. We were able to blood some young guys to MacGibbon Shield cricket and continue the development of several other players from previous seasons. We are still a very young side with a tonne of ability and hunger for success. We're also a great group of young men who are well placed to continue representing this club at the top level. Our spirit of mateship echoes the values that TWCC has long been known for and I'm looking forward to another great summer with these boys in 2019-2020!

Captain's report

The 2nd XII started the 18/19 season going up from A Grade to Menzies & Mackay Shield

We managed to get to the Christmas break only dropping 1 game where we fell 13 runs short chasing down 281.

Unfortunately, 2019 didn't start as plan with losing the first 1-day game back from the break but from there we managed to get the ball rolling again and finished off the season finishing on top of the ladder for the 3rd year in a row.

It was a great performance from the 28 players who played in the 2's over the season

We drew Clifton Hill at Frog Hollow for the Semi Final who with dropping one of their One's players made a very strong run into finals.

We got off to the best possible start with Jack Graves and Callum Linley bringing up an opening 100 run stand. We managed to get to the end of the day for 8-238.

Coming back on the Monday we were very confident that our bowlers would create the chances we just had to take them, and that we did early picking up some early wickets but then managed to drop a few chances and it was game on again but after a good restart after the tea break we switched back on to some early chances and really pegged them back and eventually finished them off getting up by 60 runs

This took us through to Grand Final against Edinburgh.

Alex Patton got us off to a flyer picking up a wicket in his second over and should have had another soon after, but a chance was put down which that batsmen very much made us pay. We got him eventually after some very tight bowling from Dem Panopoulos, after he made a very quick 90. We got a roll taking a further 5 wickets for just 30 runs until there captain and number 10 put a 70-run partnership and took their final score to 240. This was possible due to a monster performance from Alex Patton bowling 25 over taking 5 for 52

Even though it was more than what we would have liked to chase down we were confident in the ability we had and knew if we didn't lose wickets early, we had a great chance.

For the second game in a row Callum and Jack getting us to tea 0-114

Unfortunately, Cal fell soon after getting back out there, but Cal Jackson got our chase back on target before we lost both Jack for 70 and Cal in back to back overs.

Steven Cunningham and Liam Wright took us to 170 before Steve fell.

That brought Hayden Brown and Liam together who together chasing down the final 70 runs bring up a 6 wicket win and a TWCC Premiership

It was an unbelievably great year from all the boys but 2 blokes in particular who didn't play the year before and made 2 spots there's Robert Symons who took 15 Wickets @ 13.6 and Callan Jackson who scored 200 runs averaging 23 opening most of the season.

Very much looking forward to what the boys can do in the upcoming 19/20 season when we are back in Burt after a 6-year break.

Captain's report

The 3rd XI exceeded any and all expectations by winning the 2018/19 B Grade Holzer Shield.

After a two grade jump following last season's D Grade premiership, I had my concerns about how we would cope in the new grade with a developing side.

But from quite early on in the season, I could tell that we had a group of players that wanted to work hard, work together and contribute to the team when it was their turn.

Without wanting to focus on individuals too much, it would be remiss of me not to mention some of the outstanding individual performances of season 2018/19. Charlie Clarke became just the club's second ever double centurion (201* off 193) at the ripe old age of 15, and he combined for an unbeaten 329 run partnership with Vikesh Dharmasena (155* off 119). Toby Lane scored his maiden ton, batting for almost 70 overs from opening in a gritty display, where we saw ourselves 2/4 early on. And the only thing that stopped Angus Standfield scoring a century (84*) was there just weren't enough runs to chase down, as he took control and dominated Glen Waverley in a post-Christmas one-dayer.

With the ball, Zander Panopoulos took his first five wicket haul, taking 5/31 off 21 overs on a day where no other bowler looked threatening. Kane Cefai took 5/5 off 7 in a demolition of BUCCC, and Alex Christie rolled through arch-rivals Blackburn North on semi-final weekend, taking 5/16 and setting up our victory.

But what I was most proud about, was the fact that we were a team. We didn't rely on one or two individuals to decide our matches, we had a full XI I was confident in each week could contribute to a victory.

We had 10 different players score above 50 throughout the season. Every

batsman that came through the side put their hand up and made a score at some point. And on the bowling front, we also had 10 players take 3 or more wickets in an innings.

Nothing exemplified our even spread of performances more than the grand final. Going into the game, we had played St James Malvern Valley three times throughout the season (batting first all three times) and lost all three times. As a group we were still super confident that we could win the game, and despite the previous batting first results I elected to bat when tails came up.

After Toby ran himself out in the second over, Andrew Hind (66) and Angus Standfield (32) steadied to put on a 100 run partnership to get us to 1/110. However, they fell on consecutive balls (ask them how), and Matt James (61) and Eddie Thwaites (38) had to rebuild. They put on our second century partnership of the innings (which as the coach says is match winning), before we lost another three in quick succession to see us 6/218 in the 62nd. Fortunately, Rick Verrocchi (26*) and I were able to steady, capitalise on some poor fielding and get us to 6/287 off our allotted 72 overs.

With the ball, we knew we still had a job to do, and it didn't get off to a great start. St James were 0/40 off 7 before Al Christie got the first breakthrough. He got another to make it 2/74, and from there we managed to get a reasonably steady flow of wickets through Al, Darcy Clarke, Toby (who completed Operation: Cleave) Zander and myself that saw them fall well short for a total of 212.

Every single player contributed to our grand final performance. Everyone in the team either made 25 or more, took a wicket, took two catches or ran the best and most enthusiastic drinks you could possibly ask for. It was the team effort and persistence that had worked for us so well for the entire season.

I'm incredibly proud of our team, how we didn't give up and had each other's backs at all times. So many players stepped up to the challenge of B grade, and we'll need to do the same thing in season 2019/2020 as we get stuck into A Grade.

2018/19 was a brilliant year for the club. Three premierships, a true reflection of the effort put in by all and the great culture and camaraderie we display as a club. But there's more to be achieved, and I can't wait to see what we can do next season.

Captain's report

The start to the season was certainly shaky when we lost outright to St Paul's in round 1. From there we didn't lose another game to bring home the D grade Merrell Shield.

We had 38 players through the 4XI this season, all of which made a contribution to get us to finals. Of those 38 only 7 played more than 10 games – making the success of our season even more outstanding.

Our bowling all season was outstanding. We only conceded 1,432 runs in the regular season. This was followed up with dismissing Richmond Union for 45 in the Semi Final and St Pauls for 124 in the Grand Final. 27 different players bowled in the side this year. It seemed like each week we had a different bowling line up with everyone who came through the side making an impact when they were thrown the ball. We had 2 players take over 10 wickets.

The standout with the ball was Roddy Denovan. He took 18 wickets at 13.72 with an economy rate of 2.78. Roddy did a job every time the ball was thrown to him. He dried up the runs while taking regular wickets usually coming on first or second change and bowling long spells. James Hearn bowled magnificently all year for his 12 wickets at 23.92 with an outstanding economy rate of 3.78 for a young leg spinner.

Our batting was all year was also outstanding. We lost 62 wickets in the regular season and that included 20 in round 1. Due to the excellence of the bowling the highest total we had to chase all season was 197. We had 5 players make more than 150 runs for the year. 2 make more than 200 and 1 make more than 300. There were 2 centuries made for the year – by Andrew Hind and Nick Stockdale. There were 12 fifties made for year.

Andrew Hind came into the side for 4 games and completely dominated with the bat and the ball. He took 9 wickets at 5.67 with an economy rate of 1.46. With the bat he made 202 runs with an average of 101 including a magnificent 110 not out.

In the SF we won the toss and elected to bat. We got off to a shaky start losing a wicket in the first over to be 1/2. This brought Nick Stockdale to the crease with Tom Eberhard who together put on a match winning partnership of 183. Tom batted beautifully giving the strike to Nick who was bludgeoning the attack. He was finally run out coming back for a 3rd for 57 and had to be carried off the field due to severe cramps. Nick was eventually dismissed for 152 having completely destroyed the Richmond Union attack. From there things didn't go well as we collapsed to be dismissed for 243. This gave us 5 overs at the end of the day. This worked out well for us as we had them 3/11 overnight. On the second day we came out and ran through them very quickly. Our bowlers kept the ball in perfect areas and wickets came constantly as we bowled them out for 45. Paul Spark's was magnificent with 5/24 and was well backed up by Kane 2/7 and Roddy 2/3.

In the GF we also won the toss and elected to bat. We got off to a slow but steady start before losing our first wicket at 23. It was slow going as St Paul's were bowling in good areas making scoring difficult. Although the scoring was slow, we were not losing wickets so I was confident that we could still make a competitive total. Tom E and Nick put on 35 before Tom was bowled for 19. Nick was dismissed soon after for 20. This brought Nic Graves to the crease with Jason Bogie who together put on 36 with Nic making 11 and Jason 17. Roddy came in at 6 and together with Pete Cutter put on 64 runs in quick time to push the scoring along. Pete was outstanding and made 31 in quick time. Roddy was eventually dismissed for 35. The innings was closed out beautifully by David Selvey (17) and Paul Sparks (12 not out) including 10 of the last over to get us to a total of 209. Unfortunately, due to a council error the game was moved to another ground for week 2. Paul and Kane opened the bowling and kept it very tight until drinks. St Paul's were 0/35 after 18 overs. I brought James Hearn on to bowl the first over after drinks and he turned the game as the batsmen came down the track to his first ball and was stumped by Nick Stockdale. From there we took wickets at regular intervals while keeping the scoring down and kept them out of the game. Roddy came on and bowled 16 overs straight to take 2/23 with 6 maidens. Paul bowled his heart out all day ending with 19 overs 1/30 with 7 maidens. James finished with 3/31 off his 14.5 overs. Kane was outstanding again bowling 18 overs 4/38 with 5 maidens. We ended up bowling St Paul's out for 124 in the 68th over to win the GF and complete an amazing season.

I would like to thank everyone that played in the 4XI this year. Every person that played made an impact and helped us get to the finals. I would also like to thank John Graves for his support and coaching throughout the year.

Junior Vice President's report

2018/2019 was another successful year for the junior program at TWCC. This season there was a total of 230 juniors returning or joining new to the club. These were split between the Woolworths Master & Junior Blaster programs and 13 teams across the U10 / U12 / U14 / U16 / U18 age groups.

We saw a number of changes implemented, either by choice of the club, or imposed by the ECA. These included:

- Milo program rebranded and modified to the Woolworths Master Blaster and Woolworths Junior Blaster programs
- U12 A, B & C grade format modification
- Club grading for the U12, U14 & U16 age groups
- Fielding A grade teams in three age groups: U12, U14 & U16's
- Implementation of a junior coaching director to standardize age group training sessions, as well as provide extra support for our parent coaches. We thank John Graves for taking this coaching role and hope he continues for many years.
- Implementation of the U12's small-group coaching sessions additional to the normal age group training.

There were also six juniors successful in being selected to play in representative teams:

- Charlie Hester (U12)
- Ed Winneke (U12)
- Gabe Kennedy (U14)
- Mike Winneke (U14)
- Nic Graves (U14)
- Tom Walker (U16)

Congratulations to all of these players, and the parents supporting the training and game commitment associated.

The junior club was again supported by a large committee, with majority returning members. Importantly a couple of new faces also joined us. I hope all of these members will continue in these roles supporting the junior club, thus allowing us to continue to provide a high-quality cricket program. This has come about from several years of hard work and dedication of key members and continues from the enthusiasm of the current committee.

TWCC Juniors also secured a number of grants and sponsorship this year. This money has been used to the benefit of the whole club or planned for use in the near future including:

- New, easy to use, bowling machine and accessories (whole club)
- Mental health seminar (2019 off season – whole club)
- Extra coaching support: coaching assistants, coaching director (junior club)
- New clubroom fit out, dependent on Boroondara Council capital plans (future – whole club)

We would like to thank Josh Frydenberg and the Kooyong Electorate/ Federal Government, Bendigo Bank, and The Tree Company for their kind support. Without the fundraising efforts of the junior club, our club would not be able to offer quality development programs and extension opportunities for the players.

The future is bright for TWCC juniors. We expect the junior program to continue at the current numbers, with new players filling the U10's, U18's progressing to the senior ranks and the U14+ players extending themselves by taking on additional coaching and game positions in the senior teams. We will also consider the prospect of fielding additional Sunday U10 teams, as the local grounds reach capacity.
