## President's report

The 2017/18 cricket season was an enormously successful season for the club both on and off the field.

Leading into the season my primary goal as President was to build momentum on the back of the 2016/17 1<sup>st</sup> XI premiership that saw the club Firsts move back into MacGibbon Shield. I wanted the joy and excitement of that premiership to flow through the whole club both on and off the pitch. I saw positive and important shifts in club spirit and camaraderie last season and was confident that as a club we could build on this. We have and I am proud to share some of our key successes.

On the field, Tim McKenna continued to lead our Firsts, back in MacGibbon shield. Although just missing out on finals they showed they are a team on the rise. Our Seconds, Thirds and Fourths, captained by Hayden Brown, Pete Cutter and Sam Johnson respectively, all had successful seasons, all playing off in Grand Finals which ultimately led to a Premiership for our 3<sup>rd</sup> XI. Our 5<sup>th</sup> XI continued to be a link between junior and senior cricket and provided an excellent, low-pressure pathway for the juniors to take their first steps in senior cricket.

Our juniors continue to be well managed and well coached. Premiership success was enjoyed by the U12 Green team (coached by Paul Sparks and Andrew Hind) and the U16 Gold team (coached by John Hearn and Matt Veitch). The strength of our junior program is testament to the vision of those involved. The continued investment in the junior club is a real cornerstone to the ongoing success of our club and the fact that 27 juniors played senior cricket this season shows how successful the program continues to be. I would particularly like to mention the outstanding work being done by Andrew Hind (this season's best junior clubman), Tom O'Hanlon (In2cricket coordinator), Graeme Kelly (Junior Vice-President) and John Hearn (club Treasurer). I'd like to thank all the parents involved in the junior club as well as all the girls and boys who come down and play. I am very confident in the future strength of our junior program.

The final on-field comment I'd like to make is of the fantastic ongoing contribution made by our club coach John Graves. His high-value group training sessions as well as individual coaching sessions have had a definite impact on the success of the club. There has been a clear relationship between the individual batting sessions and runs scored this season. To John, thank-you for your efforts this year and I hope you have the desire to continue next season.

Off the field we have taken some enormous steps taken this season.

The young committee continues to step up and take on more responsibility. We had 16 people volunteer for the committee at the start of the season and it was decided to accept them all. Excluding myself and John Hearn the average age of the committee this

season was just 22 years. That is a significant shift from recent years both in terms of average age and numbers. The performances of Vice-President Zach Schloeffel and Secretary Alex Christie are particularly worthy of mention as they took on the responsibilities of dealing with the ECA and the City of Boroondara. The future of the club looks bright with young people of this calibre coming through the ranks.

A number of new sponsors joined our club this season. Bad Shepherd Brewing Company became our major sponsor in what was a very popular addition to the club. Owner Dereck Hales assisted us with securing a keg system for the first time in club history. Having draught beer out of a tap was certainly well received by the members. Bad Shepherd also assisted in organising a social T20 match versus Carnegie Cricket Club. This was an outstanding evening hosted by Carnegie and while we did not win the game the boys acquitted themselves admirably and players and supporters enjoyed the post-match celebrations. We are very hopeful the Bad Shepherd Cup will become an annual fixture. The other notable investment by Bad Shepherd was our partnership to brew a bespoke summer ale specifically for TWCC. The Frog Hollow Summer Ale stubbies were a great branding exercise for the club and enjoyed by all who purchased a slab. Having our own branded beers was certainly noticed by our opponents and their supporters with many positive comments about both the beer and TWCC as a club.

I would also like to mention the wonderful, ongoing support we receive from Bendigo Bank. The club is very grateful for the various community grants we have received. These grants have allowed us to upgrade equipment, primarily for the junior club, as well as allowing us to invest in capital equipment such as the defibrillators we installed at our three home grounds. To Julieann Byron and Nick Coker at Bendigo Bank I extend my sincere thanks.

The Glenferrie Hotel also supported the club this season and, like Bad Shepherd, provided match day awards. They also hosted our annual Presentation Night. I thank General Manager Drayson Bushell for his support.

I am very hopeful these sponsor relationships will last for many years and again I thank the management at each organisation for their support of our club.

The social calendar was fantastic this season. Highlights were Darcy's Darts, Dos's Spit Roast and Big Bash Week in the bunker. We celebrated the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the 1<sup>st</sup> XI premiership captained by Damien Garlick with a reunion at the club. We were very excited that almost the entire team could be there and share some tall tales with the current players. The club also achieved 5 senior wins twice this season and, as per the "rules", free soft drinks and, this season, a free keg, were enjoyed by an enthusiastic audience. The third installment of the Unders vs Overs match was an incredibly exciting game with some last ball heroics from Tim McKenna ensuring the Over 25's remained undefeated however this will not be the case for much longer I would think.

I would also like to thank everyone who has contributed to our club this season. From cleaning up to cooking barbecues, from taking the bins out to buying the meat and bread, to supporting in person or keeping in touch via social media, from stocking the fridge to simply coming back to the club and helping to empty it, this season has seen a significant increase in involvement by club members and supporters. We are a club run by volunteers and when the workload is shared everybody wins. It is no coincidence that as more people have become involved TWCC has become more successful and a great place to be. So, to the players, the wives and girlfriends, the parents, the former players, the non-playing supporters and the sponsors – thank you. We couldn't have done it without you.

Finally, looking forward. There is still much to do.

Next season we will of course be aiming to win more premierships across the grades. However, beyond that, we are looking forward to perhaps gaining new clubrooms. We are hopeful of adding a Veterans team in the near future. We are always aiming to grow the playing group. This season some fantastic people joined our club and I hope this can be repeated next season. I hope to continue building the relationships with our sponsors and even adding some new ones. But most importantly, I look forward to more friendship and fun because after all, that's why we're here.

Have a safe winter and I hope to see you all at preseason for the 2018/19 season.

### Captain's report

After a memorable 2016-17 season, which included a First XI Burt Shield premiership, the 1sts returned to Macgibbon Shield for the 2017-18 season. For many players it was their first taste of top grade cricket, playing against the strongest sides in the synthetic competition.

We began the season with unbelievable victory – chasing 263 against Edinburgh at Frog Hollow. Edinburgh played in the previous two Macgibbon Shield Grand Finals and are considered by many to be the strongest club in the association. Great performances from Mike Sparks and Alex Christie with the bat, backed up a tight bowling performance from Jake Barker the week before. Unfortunately we went on to lose our next four one day games, which was to prove costly later in the season.

Back to two day cricket and we played out a gutsy draw against Clifton Hill after the game was put into ordinary conditions. After bowling out Clifton Hill for 173 in 86 overs we left ourselves 40 overs to chase the score. The boys chased aggressively and lost a few wickets along the way, ultimately abandoning the chase and surviving the overs to finish at 9/126 at stumps. A tough one day loss to Deepdene was next, unfortunately unable to chase down 160 in Keith Carr's 1000<sup>th</sup> game in the ECA. It was a great honour to be a part of such a special game and although we lost it was thoroughly enjoyed by all players and supporters.

Heading into the last round before Christmas the lads faced the defending premiers Boroondara at Frog Hollow. A disappointing batting effort left the side defending 128 for victory which proved just enough as an exceptional bowling performance from David McKenna and Nick Sparks dismissed the Cobras for 118. This left us with 2 wins, 1 draw and 5 losses at the break and squarely in the gun of relegation if we didn't come home strong in the New Year.

Heated out in the first game back, then rained out the next Saturday, left two one day games to be played over the following Saturday/Sunday. The first against Boroondara at Victoria Rd. Boroondara batted first and posted 239 - a formidable score in a one day game. What followed was reminiscent of the chase in round one. A real team batting effort led by Sam Jordan with 88\* managed to chase down the score in the final over. An unbeaten 64 run partnership between Sam and Tom Clarke getting the lads over the line and providing a much needed victory. The momentum continued the following day as the boys routed STC with a 10 wicket victory. Set up by a game winning spell by Nick Sparks, cleaning up their top order with 4/14 the lads chased down 86 without losing a wicket.

Another resounding victory followed against STC in the next round. 349 runs were scored by TWCC on day one, with contributions all down the card. Nick Sparks top scoring with 82, including seven sixes. To back up his performance with the bat Nick then took 4/39 with the ball as we bowled out STC for 141 – a 208 run win and securing our place in MacGibbon for next season.

A tough loss in the next two day game against Toorak-Prahran unfortunately ended our fast finish towards a finals spot, however we responded in style in the final round. Playing Glen Waverley out at Brentwood Reserve we appeared in trouble at 6/71, but enter Sam Jordan who batted with great assistance from David McKenna and Jake Barker to record his maiden century for the club and finish unbeaten on 121\* and TWCC at 9/275. A solid bowling display dismissed Glen Waverley for 204 and ended the season on a winning note.

From a captain's point of view I'm bloody proud of every bloke who played in the ones this year – particularly to those that made it a priority and played every game. It's disappointing not to play in a final, but we learnt a lot this year and will continue to be motivated for next season. I saw great improvement from every player and we continue to play better as a team and develop as young men. We're mates first and have become great friends on and off the field, which is what makes a club successful. Can't wait for 2018-19 – Go TWCC!
